HOLY WEEK

Palm Sunday – April 2. **Worship Services will be at 8 and 10am.** We will start our services in the Welcome Center with the distribution of Palms.

Thursday April 6 at 6pm -Maundy Thursday Seder

We will begin at 6:00 PM with the Seder, the Passover meal Jesus celebrated with the disciples in the Upper Room the night before He was crucified. At this Last Supper, Jesus instituted the sacrament of Communion and washed the feet of his disciples as a sign that they were to be servants. At this meal, you'll learn about some of our Jewish roots and how much of the Christian heritage comes from that tradition. ***This year reservations will be required to attend. There will be a sign-up sheet in welcome center or call church office 518-885-1031***

Following the Eucharist, we will begin the **all-night Prayer Vigil**, reminding us of the time Jesus spent in the Garden of Gethsemane the night before his arrest. There will be a sign-up sheet in the Welcome Center. We hope every hour until noon on Good Friday will be filled.

Friday April 7 at Noon and 6pm - Good Friday Worship

The noon service includes the Stations of the Cross a devotional approach to the 14 events (some Biblical and some traditional) that were part of Jesus' journey from trial to crucifixion. The evening service gives those who work during the day an opportunity to worship and focusing on the cross of Christ.

Saturday, April 8 at 8:00 PM - The Great Easter Vigil

The first Eucharist of Easter will begin in the dark as the Paschal candle is lit. As the congregants light their candles and proclaim "Jesus is the Light of the World," we hear stories from the Old Testament. Then, if there are any to be baptized, we do so, making a commitment to Christ by renewing our own vows. Then, as we turn on the lights and proclaim "Jesus is Risen!" we celebrate the Easter Eucharist.
