

To that point my wife shared with me this simple but powerful story about grace by Karen Witemeyer that I wish to share with you.

The Face of Grace

It was graduation morning. My high school had selected me to be a junior escort for the seniors accepting diplomas that day, and I was late. I called out a goodbye to my mom and hustled down the stairs. I turned the key and shifted into reverse while the garage door rumbled open. My mind wandered to the upcoming ceremony as I backed down the drive. Something crunched. Angry with my brother for leaving his skateboard out, I grumbled and pulled forward.

When I got out, my eyes widened with horror. I hadn't run over a skateboard. I'd bashed into the side of my mom's car. As I imagined her disappointment and anger, I began to cry and ran into the house where I confessed between sobs.


My mom listened, surprisingly unruffled. "Don't worry about it, honey, she said. "Just go on." Stunned by her calm compassion, I did. Twenty years later, I can't remember a thing about that graduation service, but the memory of my mother's grace remains vivid.

To administer to a Diocese as a committee has been challenging. Bishop Election Update

There are four nominees for Bishop. The Diocese will be putting out information on each candidate with a publication with each candidate responding to the same questions. This will give us some insight as to who we think will serve us best. In August, all four candidates will be traveling together to four different locations in the diocese to give people a chance to meet them and hear their thoughts on different issues. These gatherings will also be live streamed and recorded. September 9 there will be a special election convention held at the Cathedral. Our clergy and lay delegates from Christ Church will then have the opportunity to vote on the person we believe the Holy Spirit is calling to be our next Bishop. Your delegates elected at our annual meeting this past winter are Don and Julie Rohr and Bonnie Hall. Our alternate delegate is Ann Wait. If for some reason one of our delegates can't attend, Ann would step in. Please hold this election in your prayers that as a diocese we elect the best person to serve as our next Bishop.

A virtual convention was held June 10. The order of business was very limited, only voting for people to serve on various committees and voting on the budget. The reason for the virtual convention this

year was because of a second in person convention in September to elect a new Bishop.

The organ in our sanctuary has been cared for over the past 15 years by Lemieux and Associates Pipe Organ Co. from Argyle, NY. Dan Lemieux, the owner, has been consistent in his efforts to maintain the quality of the organ operation. However, there were many upgrades needed. Christ Church is over 200 years old and it seems likely that the organ was here from the beginning. Due to the generosity of Beverly Granger and Ruth Shiebler, the necessary work was accomplished, the organ has been restored, and a new console installed. The organ is functioning again.


