We have had a busy fall in the Food Pantry. As a result of becoming a Food Pantries member, we now are receiving deliveries from the

Regional Food Bank on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays of the month. We typically receive 3000 pounds of food each time! In addition, Capital Roots and other organizations also donate to the Food Pantries so we have been receiving diapers, baby food, and all kinds of fresh produce twice a month as well.

We are also using software now to keep track of our clients. This digitalization will help us keep more accurate records and help us to more easily get data needed to apply for grants.
